Malignant Hematologic Disorders Leukemia/Lymphoma Inpatient Service

EDUCATIONAL GOALS:

- 1. To implement the appropriate initial workup for a patient suspected of having acute leukemia, and can interpret the results to arrive at the correct diagnosis
- 2. Be able to perform a bone marrow biopsy and aspirate adequately
- 3. To choose appropriate first-line therapy for AML and ALL, taking into account both patient-related (i.e. age, comorbidities, goals of care) and disease-related factors (i.e. karyotype and molecular mutations), and able to cite supporting evidence from the literature
- 4. To discuss the risks and benefits of induction chemotherapy with the patient and obtain informed consent
- 5. To select appropriate salvage therapy for AML and ALL and can cite supporting evidence from the literature
- 6. To identify appropriate candidates for potential allogeneic hematopoietic stem cell transplantation
- 7. Be able to deliver bad news to patients regarding issues such as undesired lab and biopsy reports and end of life issues
- 8. To manage medical emergencies related to hematologic malignancies, including tumor lysis syndrome, febrile neutropenia, hyperleukocytosis, differentiation syndrome, and dissemination intravascular coagulation
