Visiting Student Learning Opportunity (VSLO) increasing equity, diversity and inclusion in medicine

Purpose: The University of Maryland School of Medicine Department of Otolaryngology is dedicated to cultivating an inclusive environment and training a diverse physician workforce well prepared to promote health equity and serve our diverse patients in Baltimore and beyond.

We aim to engage students from diverse backgrounds who show passion in the field and a commitment to underserved communities. With a combination of clinical exposure, structured mentorship, and opportunities for community engagement, we'll give you a valuable glimpse into your future as a resident in our program.

We encourage applications from medical students who:

- Are enrolled and in good standing at an LCME accredited allopathic medical school or osteopathic school of medicine accredited by the Commission on Osteopathic College Accreditation
- Are completing their final year in medical school
- Have passed USMLE Step 1 or COMLEX Level 1
- Have completed surgery core clerkship experiences
- Come from or have experience serving underrepresented and disadvantaged populations

Program Details: This Visiting Student Learning Program provides a scholarship up to \$1000 to defray the costs of elective fees, lodging and transportation. <u>Funds are awarded upon completion of the elective and receipts are submitted for reimbursement</u>. The elective program consists of:

- Providing students with an excellent clinical experience in the Department of Otolaryngology
- Pairing students with a faculty and resident/fellow who will serve as an advisor and mentor

Application Requirements:

- Apply to an Otolaryngology Elective/Sub-Internship offered by the University of Maryland School of Medicine through the Visiting Student Learning Opportunities (VSLO) website
- A completed Visiting Elective Student Scholarship Application Form
- A letter of intent highlighting the applicant's interest in Otolaryngology and how you plan to promote health equity in your future career (should not exceed 1 page typed)
- An Updated Curriculum Vita
- An official medical school transcript
- Email materials to mlantaya@som.umaryland.edu

Application Timeline and Selection Process:

Applications must be submitted by May 1st, 2024
