The University of Maryland Medical Center (UMMC) provides a full range of health care services, coordinated across its downtown and midtown Baltimore hospital campuses and several community locations. As the flagship of the University of Maryland Medical System, UMMC serves as a referral center for the most critically ill and injured patients in the Mid-Atlantic region. UMMC was established in 1823 in partnership with the first public medical school in the nation. Since that time, UMMC has trained generations of physicians, nurses and other health professionals as an international leader in patient care, research and education.



The R Adams Cowley Shock Trauma Center is the world leader in trauma care, research and training, one of the highest volume trauma centers in the US, and the heart of Maryland's model emergency medical services system.

The University of Maryland Children's Hospital is a regional resource for diagnosing and treating infants through young adults, and is ranked among the top in the nation for pediatric cardiology and cardiac surgery by *U.S. News & World Report*.

The University of Maryland Marlene and Stewart Greenebaum Comprehensive Cancer Center (UMGCCC) is an NCI-designated comprehensive cancer center, one of only 53 top cancer treatment and research centers in the nation. Construction of UMGCCC's new home is underway, the Roslyn and Leonard Stoler Center for Advanced Medicine, started in 2021, will provide state-of-the-art inpatient and outpatient cancer services to meet the increasing demands for cancer care well into the future.

The University of Maryland Division of Transplantation is one of the region's most active transplant programs—performing more than 300 organ transplants a year. The Scientific Registry of Transplant Recipients recognized UMMC for above-average one year kidney transplant outcomes in adults.

The University of Maryland Heart and Vascular Center is a national leader in minimally invasive treatment options and a top research center with the ability to access to the latest technologies and treatments before they are widely available.

The world-class **University of Maryland Center for Diabetes and Endocrinology** located on the midtown campus, a program nationally recognized by the American Diabetes Association with a robust Diabetes Prevention Program certified by the Center for Disease Control.

University of Maryland Neurosciences is nationally recognized for pioneering noninvasive and minimally invasive techniques and breakthrough treatments for a broad range of neurological disorders.

The **Center for Pulmonary Health,** recognized by *U.S. News and World Report* as a high-ranking program in the area of pulmonary and lung surgery and COPD, offers comprehensive care for a range of lung disorders.

A REGIONAL CENTER FOR SPECIALTY AND CRITICAL CARE

UMMC is a leader in **time-sensitive critical care**, with referrals coordinated by **Maryland ExpressCare**. **Nearly one-third of all beds at UMMC are dedicated to critical care**, also called intensive care, in 11 specialized units dedicated to subspecialties such as neurotrauma, cardiac surgery, cardiac care and neurological critical care. The new Outpatient Tower located on the midtown campus is home to expert, accessible and connected care and wrap-around services to help people manage multiple, related long-term conditions.

The Level IV **Drs. Rouben and Violet Jiji Neonatal Intensive Care Unit** (NICU) is the largest of only two Level IV
NICUs in the state, providing the highest level of care to babies
born prematurely or with complications. Neonatology faculty at
the University of Maryland School of Medicine have discovered
that lighting and sound levels matter for tiny infants, so the 52-bed
NICU emulates the environment in a mother's womb.

The UMMC extra-corporeal membrane oxygenation program was named a **Center of Excellence Gold Level** for 2023 by the Extracorporeal Life Support Organization.

The Joint Commission recognizes UMMC as a **Comprehensive Stroke Center**, a designation awarded to 297 centers in the US and is one of only two centers in Maryland.

UMMC is among the less than 10 percent of US hospitals with **Magnet Designation for nursing excellence**, as recognized by the American Nurses Credentialing Center.

Both campuses of UMMC provide **comprehensive inpatient and outpatient services in behavioral health**, for children, adolescents and adults.

DEDICATED TO COMMUNITY HEALTH IMPROVEMENT

UMMC's downtown and midtown campuses together provide more than \$306.4 million a year in services that benefit our community.

As one of Baltimore's larger employers, UMMC provides workforce development programs for adults and teens. In 2022, UMMC hired 600 residents from West Baltimore and over 70 students from a nearby city school through the YouthWorks program. Additionally, UMMC piloted an eight-week no-cost UMMC Certified Nursing Assistant Program. The paid training course provides on-the-job training and education to trainees in nursing assistance roles. Upon successful completion, trainees often transfer to a new role providing patient care at UMMC.

In collaboration with nearly 20 community partners including University of Maryland School of Nursing, UMMC is dedicated to reducing social isolation and improve heart health in West Baltimore.

The McCulloh Health Center, a nurse practitioner led clinic, provides social needs screenings and resources to residents of McCulloh Homes at City View to address social needs and improve hypertension rates.

In partnership with the state of Maryland and Johns Hopkins Medicine, UMMC is expanding access to programs to reduce diabetes in Baltimore City over the next three years. Over 300 West Baltimore residents have enrolled in free education programs focused on understanding diabetes risk factors, managing diabetes, cooking classes, healthy food access, support groups, and exercise classes.
